SECOND READING 2 Peter 3:8–15a

⁸Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. ⁹The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. ¹⁰But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.

NICENE CREED

With the whole Church, let us confess our faith:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

ANNIVERSARY OF OUR CONGREGATION


We give thanks to God as we celebrate the 115th anniversary of the founding of our congregation on December 6, 1908. The formation of the congregation goes back to 1903, when Lutherans in Summit began gathering for worship on an occasional basis. A Swedish Lutheran church already existed in Summit, that congregation is now Faith Lutheran Church, New Providence, but as our founding name, Saint John's English Evangelical Lutheran Church, implies we were to be an English speaking congregation albeit with Germanic roots. In 1963, the congregation moved from the original church building on DeForest Avenue to our present location. This congregation also helped found two daughter congregations: Gloria Dei in Chatham and the former Good Shepherd, now Amazing Grace, in Florham Park. We have raised up several pastors and deacons for the wider church and sent generations of faithful Christians into mission in the world. By God's grace we have come this far, and trusting that same grace we move into the future.

We give thanks, O God, for the members and the ministry of this congregation: for those who had the vision to begin this congregation, those who sustain its present ministry, and those who will carry its mission forward into the future.

Let us pray. O God, you have promised through your Son to be with your church forever. We give you thanks for those who founded this community of believers and for the signs of your presence in our congregation. Increase in us the spirit of faith and love, and make our fellowship an example to all believers and to all nations. We pray through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

Wine is served from the chalice—either by intinction or drinking from the common cup.


Wine and grape juice are available in pre-filled individual cups.


