



Jeanne Friedman has been friends with Gladys since they met at the Philadelphia High School for Girls in 1967—longer than any other friend she has. They have been singers and soul-mates, and were sister-colleagues at Mount Holyoke College for the 6 years that Gladys served there as Dean of Religious and Spiritual Life and Director of Diversity and Inclusion.

The Rev. E. Roy Riley is the retired bishop of the New Jersey Synod, ELCA where he served from 1991–2013. Roy asked Gladys to be one of his four Assistants when he was first elected bishop and has been a friend, pastor, and mentor ever since.

The Rev. Janet Peterman is one of "The Women," an amazing group of women pastors and friends who have been meeting several times annually and, since COVID began, weekly via ZOOM. Today, she celebrates her 40th ordination anniversary and now will have the distinction of being the only one of the "Women" who will still be actively serving as a pastor.

The Rev. Mary Forell was Gladys' internship supervisor at St. Matthew's in Jersey City from 1982–83, and has had many different pastoral "rotations" with Gladys since then. Mary was a national staff person under the Rev. Harvey Peters when Gladys was an urban pastor in Jersey City, and Gladys was Mary's Assistant to the Bishop during her time on Bishop Riley's staff. She is one of "The Women" and a dear friend and colleague.

The Rev. Barbara Lundblad is one of the ELCA's preeminent preachers and the third one of "The Women." She has been a friend, confidant, and preacher at a few of Gladys' installations, including the one here at St. John's, and Gladys' main Maine "Inn-keepers" owner along with her wife Nicole.


