


Eternal God, maker of heaven and earth, who formed us from the dust of the earth, who by your breath gave us life, we glorify you. **We glorify you.**




The Holy Gospel according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.


THE GREAT THANKSGIVING




Please be seated. RECEPTION OF COMMUNION




COMMUNION HYMN ELW 574 Here I Am, Lord


COMMENDATION

Charles T. Connelly, aka "Charlie", passed away peacefully in his sleep on September 22, 2023. Charlie met his wife, Millie, when they were 7 years old, as she was "the girl downstairs", and they were married November 29, 1952. Together they raised 4 children, Charles Jr., deceased 7/23/02, Frances Rice, (Vaughn), Susan Colombo, (Dominick), and George Connelly, (Beth). Connelly Plumbing, a well-known local business.
