
Let us draw near with a true heart, and confess our sins to God, seeking forgiveness in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.



¹As [Jesus] walked along, he saw a man blind from birth. ²His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" ³Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned; he was born blind so that God's works might be revealed in him. ⁴We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming when no one can work. ⁵As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." ⁶When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made mud with the saliva and spread the mud on the man's eyes, ⁷saying to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which means Sent). 

An Update during COVID 19

St. John's friends and family, we are currently living an anxious and uncertain time. The Coronavirus pandemic has upended schools, work, family, and church life in unprecedented ways. Your Church staff is talking daily to address new situations and to plan how to continue to meet the needs of the congregation and the community we are called to serve. Below are a few updates about current plans of how to continue to connect as a congregation even during this time of physical distancing. It goes without saying that plans continue to change, sometimes daily or even hourly.

The most important thing to remember is we are still Church and God is still God. This may be somewhat of a wilderness time for us, but God hasn't brought us this far along the way to abandon us now. We trust and we pray.

The Church now has a Zoom account for remote meetings. You can log on via a computer, tablet, or smartphone. Additionally, you may call in from any phone. This will allow us to see and speak to another one other. Some committees are already making plans to use Zoom and we will be exploring other means of using Zoom in the near future.

There is a lot going on, lots of changes, lots of information, lots of stress. The pastors are proposing hosting virtual check-in and prayer meetings for people to stay connected and share their mutual burdens. If you would be interested in a Zoom check-in meeting, please email <u>Pastor Blake</u> and share what days and times would work best for you.





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
Feeling God's Love

Color in the six steps on the road. Where are we on this road today? Circle that number.







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
LENT 4
