Wir danken dir, Herr Jesu Christ ("We bless you, Lord Jesus Christ") is a hymn of thanksgiving for Christ's atonement. Written by a native of Bohemia, Christoph Fischer or Vischer (1520–97) was ordained a pastor at Wittenberg in 1544 and served congregations in Schmalkalden, Meiningen, and Halberstadt, cities in the present-day eastern area of Germany. Though a copious writer, only this Passiontide hymn survives. It was first published in the Dresden Gesang-Buch (Dresden Songbook) in 1597. The last verse might serve as a prayer during the virtual Recorder Ensemble's performance of this setting by Wilhelm Friedemann Bach, J. S. Bach's second child and eldest son: In Thee we trust, in Thee alone; For Thou forsakest not Thine own; To all the meek Thy strength is giv'n, Who by Thy cross ascend to heav'n.

#### FIRST READING Jeremiah 31:31–34

<sup>31</sup>The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. <sup>32</sup>It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. <sup>33</sup>But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. <sup>34</sup>No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the LORD," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

<sup>6</sup>as he says also in another place,


"You are a priest forever,

<sup>7</sup>In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. <sup>8</sup>Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; <sup>9</sup>and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, <sup>10</sup>having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Whoever serves me, the Father will honor.

<sup>27</sup>"Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. <sup>28</sup>Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." <sup>29</sup>The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." <sup>30</sup>Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. <sup>31</sup>Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. <sup>32</sup>And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." <sup>33</sup>He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.



What kind of bread does your church use for communion? Draw it here.






# PRE-READER

Lent occurs in the spring. Color in the picture of the flowers below to remind yourself that spring is coming.






People began serving and helping others. They were following Jesus!
