



NICENE CREED

Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human. 

A Long Way to Go


On Palm Sunday, Jesus rode a donkey into Jerusalem.

On Maundy Thursday, Jesus gave the disciples bread and wine.

On Good Friday, Jesus prayed in the garden. And Jesus died on the cross.

But that was **not the end** of Jesus' journey!

Jesus walked a long way, telling people about God. Even when he died on the cross, it was not the end of his journey to share God's love with everyone. Use a pencil or crayon to make a rubbing of part of your shoe's sole to remind you of how far Jesus traveled.
