





The Holy Gospel according to Matthew. Glory to you, O Lord.



This must never happen to you." ²³But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; for you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

²⁴Then Jesus told his disciples, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ²⁵For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. ²⁶For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life? 



Walk the Walk


What has happened during your walk of life? In each tree along this road, write or draw about an important moment in your life.

This week, play a game of Bible Blitz at home. Every day, open the Bible to any page and read one verse.






