



Let us commit our whole selves to God and our neighbors.


Shape in us generous hearts. Take our time, our talents, and treasure for the work of your kingdom. Make us joyful givers and faithful stewards.


OFFERTORY PRAYER





COMMUNION HYMN ELW 733 Great Is Thy Faithfulness


