²¹and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²²let us approach with a true heart in

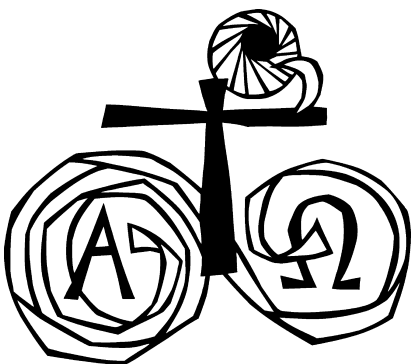
full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies

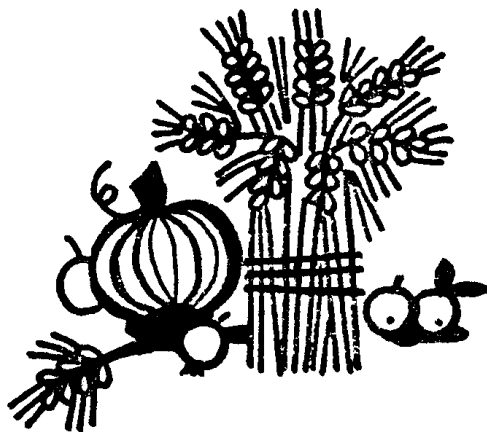
Advent is coming, November 28! Devotional books are now available.
