



⁵Good indeed is the Lord, whose steadfast love is everlasting, whose faithfulness endures from age to age.


SECOND READING Romans 5:1–8

⁶For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. ⁸But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.





If you wish to receive communion, please approach the pastor one at a time.


The pastor will place a wafer in your open hands. Please indicate if you need a gluten free wafer.

Wine is served from the chalice—either by intinction or drinking from the common cup.


Wine and grape juice are available in pre-filled individual cups.

COMMUNION HYMN ELW 614 There Is a Balm in Gilead




