- ¹For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. ² For in this tent we groan, longing to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling— ⁵ He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee.
- ⁶ So we are always confident; even though we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord— ⁷ for we walk by faith, not by sight. ⁸ Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. ⁹ So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. ¹⁰ For all of us must appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil.




THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

You may pick up your personal cup, being careful to only touch that cup.


Step aside and drink the wine, placing the used cup in the return tray.


COMMENDATION


