¹⁰Put no trust in extortion; in robbery take no empty pride; though wealth increase, set not your heart upon it.



Some of Jesus' disciples were fishermen. Circle the fish that tells us what week of Epiphany it is. Color the rest of the fish in different colors.







"Let's catch people instead of fish."

Help the disciple get through the maze by coloring the pointy leaves green.








Today, you heard about the disciples. They were Jesus' followers. Look around you during worship. You'll see many more of Jesus' followers.







- Today is the **3**rd **Sunday** of Epiphany.

From the Tree


During Epiphany, we celebrate our growth in Jesus. Can you connect each tree in the top row with something it's connected to in the bottom row?


